
Advanced and ENHANCED practice


- ACP (AP)
- Advanced Clinical Practitioner. (Some people use AP, Advanced Practitioner but confusing because of Assistant Practitioners who different!)
- ANP
- Advanced Nurse Practitioner, same, just specifying a nurse as opposed to any professional background.
- FCP
- First contact practitioner Enhanced role (some people know as extended role) ECP.

'Advanced clinical practice is delivered by experienced, registered health and care practitioners. It is a level of practice characterised by a high degree of autonomy and complex decision making. This is underpinned by a master's level award or equivalent that encompasses the four pillars of clinical practice, leadership and management, education and research, with demonstration of core capabilities and area specific clinical competence......
